

PMI-Montréal Scholarship

The objectives of the PMI Montreal Scholarship Program are to

- to promote adherence to PMI-Montreal's values of quality and excellence in project management (PM).
- to recognize the graduate training (master's degree) of the next generation of students.
- To promote academic excellence in Project Management.
- to encourage philanthropy among universities in its territory that offer graduate training in Project Management.
- to create a relationship of trust by offering a three-year partnership Amount

The scholarship is valued at **\$1,000**

Eligibility criteria

The applicant must be registered in a university that offers master's level project management training in the territory covered by PMI-Montreal, in one of the following universities:

- Université du Québec à Montréal (UQAM) - 4 scholarships
- École Polytechnique - 2 scholarships
- École de technologie supérieure (ÉTS) - 2 scholarships
- Université de Montréal (UdeM) - 1 scholarship
- HEC - 2 scholarships
- ENAP - 1 scholarship
- Concordia - 1 scholarship
- Université de Sherbrooke - 1 scholarship
- Université du Québec à Trois-Rivières - 1 scholarship

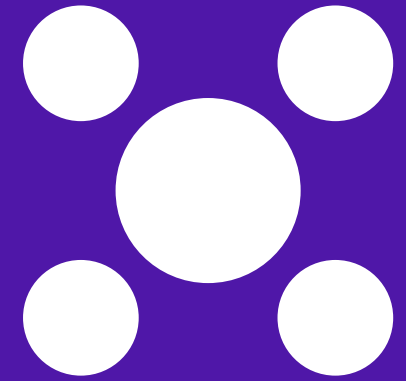
The candidate must be enrolled **full or part-time** in a program that includes **9 credits** of project management courses.

The candidate must demonstrate **a strong interest** in project management.



The winners will be presented with their scholarships during a PMI Montreal ceremony. **This ceremony will take place on Thursday, November 17, 2022, in Montreal.**

A second ceremony may be held at the candidate's home university. In this case, the date will be determined by the university concerned.



CRITERIA FOR EVALUATION

- Academic record
- A 2-page essay based on the following theme:
“What would you say to a manager or business leader who is not convinced that project management is an important tool to accomplish business change?”
- Demonstrate a complete understanding of what project management is (10 knowledge areas vs. 5 process groups, Agile vs. Traditional)
- Quality of writing (spelling, syntax)
- Originality of the treatment and the subject

CONSTITUTION OF THE FILE

Complete the PMI Montreal Scholarship form or an equivalent form provided by the university or an online application form, via the University Foundation Scholarship Awards Portal accompanied by:

- A **current** curriculum vitae
- The **most recent** transcript
- **2 letters** of recommendation

Incomplete or late applications will not be considered.

PRESELECTIONS

- Universities will be required to nominate a maximum of 2 candidates for each award made to the university.
- For each nomination, the university must attach a ranking to guide the PMI in its decision.

The university must send the files with the pre-selection to PMI Montreal, no later than **October 30, 2022 - 23:59.**
